
CHANGE OF PROGRAM

We plan to continue throughout the summer then change our meeting night during fall and winter Once we have sorted as much as we can, we will start cataloguing, computerizing and digitizing artifacts and photos. We can always use more help.


Revised By Laws

Flooding in the Basement


As some of you know, this spring we had about 18 inches of water in the basement of our museum. On our annual cleaning day we discovered the flooding and with the help of Sean Dunker-Bendigo, Russ Lanoie, Doug Haver and equipment borrowed from Cormack Builders we were able to bring the level of the water down to less than 3 inches. We then bought some hose and a small sump pump which fit in the floor drain and is keeping the water level just below the level of the floor.

The Town allowed us to hire a drain cleaning company to find out why the water was coming into the cellar. It was discovered with an under water camera that the cellar floor drain going from the building to the road was blocked. An attempt to clear it was made but was unsuccessful. I went back to the Selectmen who agreed to have Bill Chick and the town road crew dig up and replace the drain pipes. Bill met with me at the building will start on the project as soon as he has the time and when the ground has dried. He will add some new drainage down the side of the building also. We really appreciate everyone's help and the generosity of the Town.

Since everything in the cellar was saturated with water, we decided to clean everything out and remove it to the dump because of the danger of mold. Ed and Sandy Bickford, Linda Smith, Jim Coogan and I spent a couple of Monday mornings removing everything. We left fan's running down cellar for a week to dry out the floor. We discovered someone had scratched their name and date,

Mike Barne 1934, in the floor when it was originally poured. The items in the basement were covering the signature.

I contacted Maggie Stier, NH Preservation Alliance Field Representative who has assisted us in the past and let her know of our plight. She agreed to meet with us to help use this flooding incident as a catalyst for more fundraising for a new foundation (not necessarily basement) and drainage. We hope to have her come to our next board meeting. Following are some photos that we took during the disaster.....


